

Savannah River Site Surplus Property

All types of property and materials are used at the Savannah River Site (SRS) and are subsequently declared excess/surplus for various reasons. There are several ways the site ends up with excess property:

- System upgrades, making current inventory obsolete
- Material that remains from completed projects
- Spare parts that are no longer needed
- Inventory reductions
- Site cleanup

In accordance with Federal government procedures, excess property is sent to the Westinghouse Savannah River Company's (WSRC) Excess Operations for processing, cataloging and redistribution. The process for redistribution of available excess property includes:

- Re-use on site
- Re-use by other Department of Energy (DOE) facilities and DOE contractors
- Re-use by Energy Related Laboratories
- Economic Development sales
- Re-use by other Federal agencies
- Donation through State Surplus Property Offices to nonprofit organizations
- Sales *
- Internet sales

WSRC donated more over 3.6 million dollars of Department of Energy surplus property and materials to area nonprofit organizations during Fiscal Year 2001 through the State Surplus offices. These offices are authorized to obtain and distribute surplus property from SRS and other Federal and State agencies to nonprofit organizations.
