

High-Tech Equipment Helps In World Trade Center Efforts

- The Savannah River Technology Center has been providing assistance to search and rescue workers during the aftermath of the terrorist attack on the World Trade Center.
- SRTC dispatched employees with remotely operated equipment that included infrared cameras, microphones, robotic equipment, fiber optic cameras, borescopes and other tools to search for victims and evidence.
- The equipment is being used to allow personnel to see into confined spaces and areas that are too small or dangerous for humans to enter.
- Workers come to the SRTC team with a special need, and the team members come up with a suitable tool and show the workers how to use it – often within 15 minutes.
- This assistance was provided under agreement with the U.S. Department of Justice's National Institute of Justice. Under this agreement, SRTC provides a wide array of unique technology support for law enforcement efforts.
