Fax copies will not be accepted, nor can applications be hand delivered by non-SRS employees. Proposals will be evaluated by a panel of judges based on the criteria listed in the brochure. Recipients along with a guest of their choice will be invited to the awards reception on May 7, 2015.

SRNS is committed to providing assistance to the local education community by rewarding innovative teaching methods with funds to enhance elementary and middle school science, mathematics, and technology programs in the Central Savannah River Area (CSRA). Elementary and middle school educators in the seven-county CSRA (Aiken, Allendale, Bamberg, Barnwell, and Edgefield counties in South Carolina, and Columbia and Richmond counties in Georgia) are invited to submit an application for one of three categories.
