Revision 2 Action Memorandum Issued for the Non Time Critical Removal Action for the 489 D Coal Pile Runoff Basin, D-006 Outfall, and 484-10 D Waste Oil Facility at the D Area Operable Unit

Action Memorandum Issued for Transfer of the D-006 Petroleum Release Site From the D Area Operable Unit to the Savannah River and Floodplain Swamp Integrator Operable Unit

Floodplain/Wetlands Assessment Issued for the D-006 Petroleum Release Site Removal Action at the Savannah River Site

The DOE has selected the preferred alternative for the non-time critical removal action for the 489-D Coal Pile Runoff Basin, D-006 Outfall (a.k.a., D-006 Petroleum Release Site) and the 484-10D Waste Oil Facility at the D Area Operable Unit. A 30-day public comment period was held for the Removal Site Evaluation Report/Engineering Evaluation/Cost Analysis (RSER/EE/CA) from October 28, 2009 to November 28, 2009. No comments were received during the public comment period. A Revised Action Memorandum that described a phased closure approach was issued on August 26, 2010. The Revision 2 Action Memorandum that addressed the deletion of the D-006 Petroleum Release Site from the D Area Operable Unit was issued on March 24, 2011.

The Action Memorandum for the transfer of the D-006 Petroleum Release Site from the D Area Operable Unit to the Savannah River and Floodplain Swamp Integrator Operable Unit was issued on March 28, 2011. This Action Memorandum officially moved the D-006 Petroleum Release Site to the Savannah River and Floodplain Swamp Integrator Operable Unit, and acknowledged the generation of an additional 1600 cubic yards of contaminated sediment. A summary of the CERCLA applicable or relevant and appropriate requirements and the Floodplain/Wetlands Assessment were also presented in the Action Memorandum.

The Floodplain/Wetlands Assessment was prepared in compliance with 10 CFR Part 1022 as a documentation of the potential impacts of the D-006 Petroleum Release Site Removal Action. No activity associated with the project will occur within the 100-year floodplain at the Savannah River Site, but activity within jurisdictional wetlands is required to remove the contaminated sediment. The Floodplain/Wetlands Assessment is available for a 15 day for public comment period.

The selection of the preferred alternative is documented in the referenced Action Memorandums. DOE has worked with SCDHEC and the USEPA to ensure that the removal action is consistent with all applicable environmental requirements.
