EXPERIENCE

John Temple serves as the Senior Vice President, Contracts Management, for Savannah River Nuclear Solutions, LLC (SRNS). In this position, he has responsibility for administration of the prime contract, funds management, interface management, Site planning and the performance evaluation measurement plan. He is the single entry point for all contract-related matters.

Temple joined SRNS during transition between contractors after SRNS was awarded the Savannah River Site (SRS) management and operations contract. From 2008 to 2012, his responsibilities included prime contract administration and subcontract management, including American Recovery and Reinvestment Act procurement activities.

Before coming to SRS, Temple served as Director of Contracts and Pricing for aircraft carrier construction, aircraft carrier refuelings and overhauls, aircraft carrier inactivation and defueling, Department of Energy (DOE)-related ventures, and commercial nuclear-related ventures for Newport News Shipbuilding. He worked through the entire shipbuilding process from working with tools during apprenticeship to managing the Aircraft Carrier Contracts and Estimating organization. During his tenure at Newport News, he successfully integrated the estimating process into the aircraft carrier overhaul and refueling value stream, so that engineering, planning and estimating were co-located and worked as a seamless unit. He also successfully integrated the ALPHA contracting process into the aircraft carrier estimating process. This involved integration of the government's team with the contractor's team in the initial planning, work package development, estimating and budgeting process.

Temple has been with Newport News Shipbuilding for 40 years and has earned the distinction as a Master Shipbuilder.
