Committee Welcome: Tom Barnes, Committee Chair
 Mr. Barnes welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Introduction of DOE Facilitators: Jim Giusti, DOE-SR

Mr. Giusti explained that in an effort to assist the committee chair, Jack Craig, DOE-SR manager, asked the OEA staff to help facilitate the meetings. Mr. Giusti introduced Susan Clizbe as the facilitator for the meeting.

Point of Contact Status Update: Avery Hammett, DOE-SR

Ms. Hammett reviewed the current status of Environmental Management program projects.

Presentation: Air Monitoring: Eric Doman, SRNS

Mr. Doman provided an overview of the SRS Air Surveillance Program. Mr. Doman began the presentation with information from the 2014 Annual Site Environmental Report (ASER). The report identified that radionuclides are below 1% of the EPA does standard of 10 mrem/yr. Mr. Doman gave brief history of the site and the environmental monitoring program. He also reviewed the purpose and history of the air surveillance program. He explained why the program began, what the air surveillance program does and the schematics of the program. He discussed exposure pathways and examples of environmental exposure sampling. He explained the difference between effluent monitoring and environmental surveillance. Mr. Doman emphasized that SRS conducts atmospheric surveillance beyond the point of discharge. Mr. Doman described the air monitoring locations and why those locations were chosen. He provided sample parts of the filtration system for the committee to examine.

He concluded by taking questions from Committee Members.

Committee Discussion

Jim Lyon, Committee Member, gave insight and commented on environmental devices and tracking.
