

Summary Notes – August 15, 2017
 Savannah River Site (SRS) Citizens Advisory Board (CAB)
 Facilities Disposition & Site Remediation (FDSR) Committee Meeting

The SLM Committee held a meeting on Tuesday, August 15, 2017, from 6:30 – 8:20 pm, at the Department of Energy Meeting Center in Aiken, SC. It was also streamed online via YouTube and posted to the CAB website and YouTube channel. The purpose of this meeting was to receive updates on the Point of Contact status. There was also time set aside for committee discussion and public comments.

Committee Welcome: Cathy Patterson, FDSR Vice Chair
 CAB member Gillas welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Point of Contact Status Update: Avery Hammett, DOE-SR
 Ms. Hammett reviewed the current projects related to the committee prevue. She noted that the ash removal is ongoing, and one inch of rain is equal to one million gallons to remove. DOE-SR will provide an update later this year.

Q&A Session

CAB member Kaminski asked if the rain is causing a risk to the environment regarding the ash removal project, to which Ms. Hammett replied that it was not.

CAB member Gillas asked if there are no contaminants in the water because of the ash, to which Ms. Hammett replied that no, there are not and it is monitored for contaminants.

Committee Discussion: Recommendation 345 Response
 CAB member Gillas opened up discussion regarding this response.

CAB member Spinelli noted the responses are as expected from DOE. There was no further discussion so a motion was made to forward this response to the next full board meeting, which was seconded and passed with a vote.

Committee Discussion: Wounded Warrior Hunt
 CAB member Gillas opened the discussion regarding this presentation which was delivered at the previous full board meeting.

CAB member Kaminski commended the program and asked if the CAB could get more members of the public involved as volunteers.

CAB member Sheppard asked if anyone has been injured by snakes on a hunt, to which de'Lisa Carrico, DOE-SR noted that the Savannah River Ecology Lab gave a presentation on bee stings being the most cause for risk on site.

CAB member Doerr noted the CAB could sponsor or volunteer the Wounded Warrior hunting programs, volunteer, donate or solicit donations. CAB member Gillas noted that this is not in the CAB prevue, but it may be possible to do on the side.

CAB member Gillas asked if DOE-SR has noticed any changes from regulators based on the current administration making cuts to their work force, to which Ms. Hammett replied they had not and it had been business as usual thus far.

CAB member Doerr asked about the impact of the Centerra strike, to which CAB member Sheppard recounted Jack Craig's, DOE-SR site manager, response to this question during the previous committee meeting (Strategic & Legacy Management). Susan Clizbe, DOE-SR, noted that the barricades are almost all back to normal as of tomorrow. CAB member Gillas asked if this affected K Area, to which Ms. Clizbe responded that it did not.

CAB member Kaminski asked what the CAB work plan included for the rest of the calendar year. Ms. Hammett replied by reading the list from the latest issue of the CAB's *Board Beat* magazine.
