

Summary Notes – December 11<sup>th</sup>, 2018  
 Savannah River Site (SRS) Citizens Advisory Board (CAB)  
 Strategic & Legacy Management (SLM) Committee Meeting

The SLM Committee held a meeting on Tuesday, December 11<sup>th</sup>, 2018, from 6:30 – 8:20 pm, at the Department of Energy Meeting Center in Aiken, SC. It was also streamed online via YouTube and posted to the CAB website and YouTube channel.

Mr. Kaminski welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Point of Contact Status Update: Zach Todd, DOE-SR

Mr. Todd reviewed the current projects related to the committee prevue.

Q&A Session

Mr. Kaminski asked if the committee would benefit from seeing a timeline for the other EM site budgets. Mr. Tanner asked if he specifically meant other site budgets for the life cycle of the EM mission. Mr. Kaminski answered yes, and noted that would provide better context regarding the budget for SRS. Mr. Tanner noted that they could look at it and find a way to work that in. Mr. French noted that the SRS budget includes more than just the EM mission, and he also agreed that would be great if the CAB could get that data.

Committee Discussion: EM Performance Metrics

Mr. Kaminski opened discussion on this presentation from the previous full board meeting.

Mr. Cato asked if detail could be provided regarding the new WIPP waste acceptance criteria. Mr. Folk replied that after the 2014 WIPP events, they went through and redefined the WAC increasing the rigor of inspection to make sure that materials meet the WAC. He added that when it changed, all materials waiting had to be re-inspected. Mr. Todd also added that goals changed in the metrics because of issues, so they can highlight the process.

Mr. Vovakes noted that it would be great to have this table included in the presentation as a standard for all performance metrics.

Ms. Weber asked what the projection is for FY 19 as far as receiving materials and processing at H Canyon is concerned. Mr. Todd responded that it ebbs and flows, and currently he could not provide details. Ms. Weber noted that it’s concerning that it’s increasing. Mr. Folk added that the SNF program is an active program, and SRS is still receiving domestic fuel as part of the active national program to take back these materials.

Mr. Vovakes noted that the goals which were presented to the CAB the previous year did not match the current presentation, and asked why that is. Mr. Todd answered that he will have to take a look at it and get back to the CAB following the meeting.

Committee Discussion: National Environmental Research Park

Mr. Kaminski opened discussion on this presentation from the previous full board meeting. He then gave kudos to Dr. Rhodes for this presentation.

Mr. French noted that this presentation includes ecological information which can't be replaced, and the NERP at SRS includes a unique ecology.

Draft Recommendation: SRS NERP Support

Mr. Kaminski summarized the draft recommendation, and noted that a database should be added so the data can be shareable and searchable. Mr. French noted that recommendation three is intended for that, but it can be re-written to be more clear.

Ms. Weber thanked Mr. French for writing this recommendation, which she noted needed to be written.

Mr. Kaminski suggested added wording for clarification.

Ms. Weber motioned to vote to forward this recommendation to the next full board meeting, which was seconded, and the recommendation passed with 8 yay.

Mr. Vovakes asked if all of the publications from SRS are scholarly. Mr. French replied that the baseline documents describe turtles, etc. which are available online but haven't been updated in about 10 years. ll
