Proposed Action Title: Building 772-4F Emergency Roof Repair

Program or Field Office: Savannah River Site

Location(s) (City/County/State): Aiken/Aiken County/South Carolina

Proposed Action Description:

An Emergency Priority 6 repair activity was declared by the F-Area Complex (FAC) Facility Manager on May 10, 2021. Due to damage received during a storm, the 772-4F roof was leaking onto major electrical components associated with exhaust fans for F/H Labs. After a visual and tactile asbestos inspection, a Subcontractor completed the emergency roof repairs at building 772-4F to repair the detached roofing membrane.

Revision 1: This revision includes An Emergency Priority 6 repair activity for the F/HAL 772-4F roof declared by the F-Area Complex (FAC) Facility Manager. Subcontractor will provide roof repairs at 772-4F. The Subcontractor will disturb the existing roof while performing these repairs on 772-4F.
