Proposed Action Title: Remove Out of Service Make Up Water Piping at 285-H

Program or Field Office: Savannah River Site

Location(s) (City/County/State): Aiken/Aiken County/South Carolina

Proposed Action Description:

The above ground make-up water piping behind the 285-H basin is out of service and creates an unnecessary trip hazard and leak point. The affected piping has been out of service for several years. It was originally installed to provide water to Tritium facility, a Cooling tower that has been removed (285-3H), and make-up water to 285-H. Make-up water to 285-H has been re-routed due to a failed underground header. None of the impacted pipes are in service. All the connections, apart from one to Process Water Supply header, have previously been air gapped. This design disconnects the one remaining connection and removes all remaining above ground piping, Instruments and tubing between the air gaps. No in-service components will be impacted.
