## NNSA extends comment period for public scoping regarding Environmental Impact Statement for the Surplus Plutonium Disposition Program

## New deadline Feb. 18

The Department of Energy's National Nuclear Security Administration has announced that it is extending the comment period for public scoping of the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the Surplus Plutonium Disposition Program, which proposes to dilute and dispose of 34 metric tons of surplus plutonium using capabilities at multiple sites across the Nation.

The deadline for public scoping comments is now Feb. 18.
