Angelos is Senior Vice President of National Nuclear Security Administration (NNSA) Plutonium (Pu) Programs and Operations for Savannah River Nuclear Solutions (SRNS) at the Savannah River Site (SRS) in Aiken, South Carolina. His responsibility in this role is to establish the enduring Plutonium pit production program and future operations organization.

Angelos has more than 45 years of experience in government high hazard chemical and nuclear operations facilities including over 30 years of experience in NNSA programs. He most recently served as Program Office Manager for the Pu Modernization program in support of the pit production mission at SRS. In this role, he was in charge of establishing the operations and program organization for future pit production activities at the Site.

During his career, he has managed a variety of programs including waste management, chemical separations, facilities and infrastructure, Naval reactor fuel fabrication, uranium recycle, reactor fuel research and development, Defense Programs including stockpile stewardship and tritium supply, Nuclear Nonproliferation Programs, and a multi-disciplined engineering and technical professional services organization.

His past roles include serving as Executive Advisor to SRS from Global Energy Services; Vice President of the NNSA & Laboratory Operations Sector for AECOM; President of URS Professional Solutions, LLC; Sr. Vice President of URS Consulting Services; and Vice President of Nuclear Nonproliferation Program at Washington Savannah River Company.
