CSRA College Night Showcases Future Opportunities and Careers

Over 3,000 Attendees and \$15K in Scholarships Awarded During Savannah River Sitesponsored Event

AIKEN, S.C. – (September 25, 2023) – During the Savannah River Site (SRS) CSRA (Central Savannah River Area) College Night on Sept. 14, thousands of students filled the James Brown Arena in search of higher education opportunities, apprenticeships and future career paths. Fifteen local high school seniors won scholarships totaling \$15,000.

"We are filling a huge need in our community," said Cindy Hewitt, Savannah River Nuclear Solutions (SRNS) Education Outreach Specialist. "CSRA College Night highlights many different careers and opportunities for students. This enables us to connect with the future workforce, spark interest in our most needed occupations and prove to students that they can make their dreams a reality."

Associate Director of Regional Recruitment Caitlin Norton proudly represented the University of Alabama at Birmingham at one of the largest college recruitment events in the states of Georgia and South Carolina.

"This was a fantastic way to get access to thousands of students who may be undecided or looking for their next big step," said Norton. "With over 4,000 institutions in the country, this in-person event was a great way for a student to narrow down their options and find the perfect school without having to spend thousands on traveling or college visits."
